
Acceptable Items

- → Vegetables
- → Fruits
- → Herbs and spices
- → Bread
- → Pasta
- → Rice
- → Nuts and shells
- → Eggshells
- → Plant-based meat
- → Coffee + coffee filters
- → Loose-leaf tea (no tea bags)
- → Cut flowers
- → Houseplants and houseplant soil
- Paper towels + paper napkins used with food items
- → Paper bags
- → Shredded, non-glossy paper
- Cardboard that has been cut up, with all staples, tape, labels, and plastic removed
- Wooden coffee stirs and skewers (broken into ~1" pieces)
- → Biobag branded compostable liners





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Non-Accepted Items

- → Dairy
- → Meat + fish
- → Oils and greases
- → Produce stickers (they are plastic)
- → Produce twist ties + rubber bands
- → Tea bags (most are plastic)
- → Garbage + plastic
- "Compostable" or "biodegradable" single-use items (including utensils, bowls, plates, cups, coffee cups, compostable liners other than Biobag)
- → Parchment paper and wax paper
- → Glossy paper and glossy cardboard
- → Large sheets of cardboard
- Paper towels + paper napkins used with cleaning products
- → Cleaning products
- → Clothing
- → Dryer lint
- → Pet waste
- → Yard waste
